### Eligibility





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The Saturday Program prioritizes students from historically underserved backgrounds with limited access to certain educational opportunities. We especially welcome applications from women and individuals who identify with groups historically excluded from visual arts careers, such as Black, Latino/a, LGBTQ+, and Neurodiverse communities.

To be eligible, students must meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Attend a New York City Public High School.
- Attend a school without a comprehensive visual art program.
- Qualify for free school breakfast and/or lunch.
- Come from low- or moderate-income household (See [2024 NYC Area Median Income](#))

## **Become a paid lifeguard. FREE Swim Prep- 16 years or older**

Whether you're looking for a career or summer job in lifeguarding or water safety instruction, our free Swim Prep Program can help you get there.

### Who Should Apply

Through this program, intermediate and advanced-level swimmers receive free personalized training to improve their speed, endurance, and stroke technique. You can develop the skills and confidence you'll need to pass the lifeguard qualifying exam and/or water safety instructor entrance requirements.

You can register for as few or as many sessions as needed to reach your personal goal!

### Program Details

The Swim Prep Program provides participants with advanced instruction and one-on-one coaching on different strokes. Instructors will assess the following strokes and offer tips for improvement:

- Front Crawl
- Back Crawl
- Breaststroke
- Elementary Backstroke
- Sidestroke
- Butterfly

Instructors will also test your ability to pass lifeguard-specific requirements:

- 50-yard time trial
- 440-yard time trial
- Treading 2 minutes

### Schedule

Training takes place every Saturday and Tuesday between October 15, 2024 and March 29, 2025. Sessions last between 1 and 1 ½ hours. Water Safety Instructor workouts continue through June 7. Swimmers must be 16 years or older and are required to take a water competency test to show swim skills at the intermediate level.

Student is referred to Let's Get Ready by a program partner

Let's Get Ready does not make application decisions based on current or past academic records.

### Application Timeline

Let's Get Ready reviews applications on a rolling basis, and eligible students are admitted on a first-come, first-serve basis. We encourage you to apply early!

If you will be graduating from high school or earning your GED in 2025, you can expect to receive a decision from us starting in early summer (May). Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis after March 25.

**If you will be graduating from high school or earning your GED in 2024**, we will release decisions on a rolling basis regarding admittance into our Transition Core program **beginning March 25**.

**Finally, if you already graduated from high school or earned your GED**, we will release decisions on a rolling basis for admittance into our Success Core program **beginning March 25**.

### James Egan

Jim Egan is Professor of English at Brown University. His research focuses on the use of digital tools to read, engage, organize, analyze, and imagine literature in particular and storytelling more broadly. He was trained as a scholar of British-American literature before 1800, and he published *Authorizing Experience: Refigurations of the Body Politic in Seventeenth-Century New England Writing* (1999) and *Oriental Shadows: The Presence of the East in Early American Literature* (2011). His courses explore the ways literature complicates our understanding of the way we make evaluative judgements about fundamental issues related to, among other topics, justice, morality, and social responsibility. His courses routinely investigate these issues in relation to the changing ways we encounter literature in a digital world.
